



**Dominick D. Braccio**

Dominick D. Braccio is the Assistant Director of the Federal Law Enforcement Training Centers' (FLETC) Regional and International Training Directorate. In this capacity, he oversees and provides strategic direction to FLETC's training centers located in Artesia, New Mexico; Charleston, South Carolina; and Cheltenham, Maryland. Along with the regional sites, Mr. Braccio leads FLETC's program for state, local and tribal law enforcement agencies, including the partnership with the Los Angeles Port Police to deliver training at the Maritime Law Enforcement Training Center at the Port of Los Angeles. FLETC's Leadership Institute, which recently deployed immersive HYDRA technology for its groundbreaking Leadership in a Crisis training program, also falls within his scope.

Additionally, Mr. Braccio is responsible for FLETC's international activities, including those that support the International Law Enforcement Academies in Gaborone, Botswana; Bangkok, Thailand; Budapest, Hungary; San Salvador, El Salvador; and Roswell, New Mexico.

Mr. Braccio is a law enforcement veteran of 38 years. Prior to his current position, he was the Assistant Director of the Glynco Training Directorate, Chief of the Behavioral Sciences Division and Chief of the Law Enforcement Leadership Institute.

His prior law enforcement experience includes 22 years as a Special Agent with the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA). Mr. Braccio's DEA career culminated in his serving as the Assistant Special Agent in Charge of the DEA Academy in Quantico, Virginia. There, he oversaw all Leadership, Tactical, Undercover Operations, Financial Investigations, Clandestine Laboratories, and Narco-Terrorism training for 87 foreign offices worldwide. He was also responsible for training all DEA Sensitive Investigative Units and the newly formed police units in Iraq and Afghanistan. He was a Special Agent in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and Detroit, Michigan; the DEA's Assistant Country Attaché in Rome, Italy; and the supervisor of the Violent Traffickers Task Force in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Mr. Braccio also spent seven years as a police officer in Pennsylvania where he served as a patrol sergeant, detective, and motorcycle officer.

Mr. Braccio earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice from West Chester University and a Master of Education from the University of Virginia. He served as an adjunct faculty instructor at the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) National Academy with the University of Virginia, and as a guest instructor at The Citadel Military College of South Carolina and Clemson University. He co-authored the DEA International Training Handbook.

Mr. Braccio has received numerous awards, including the Administrator's Award, the DEA's highest recognition, as well as the Women in Federal Law Enforcement Foundation's Outstanding Advocate for Women in Federal Law Enforcement Award, and a Commendation from the FBI Director.
